Optimizing Listening, Language and Literacy of Children of Diverse Needs who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

As a result of developments in hearing technology and early intervention, students with hearing loss can have an increased ability to learn language through listening. However, technology alone will not ensure that students with auditory access through cochlear implants, digital hearing aids and/or FM systems will learn to make sense of the sound they receive from these devices. Teachers, educational audiologists, speech language pathologists need to develop skills for assessing, developing and monitoring auditory skill development appropriate to the strengths and challenges of the individual child. Mary Koch's workshop provides theoretical frameworks, as well as practical strategies for optimizing auditory skills in children with a range of skills and communication modalities, including ASL or other types of visual language skills.



Mary Koch is a graduate of Smith College and Gallaudet University, she has worked in Oral, Total Communication, and Auditory-Verbal programs. She began working with a child with single channel cochlear implants in 1983, and, in 1994, developed the children's cochlear implant rehabilitation program at The Listening Center at Johns Hopkins. Currently working with Baltimore County Infants and Toddlers, and providing cochlear implant rehabilitation training workshops throughout the United States and Canada.

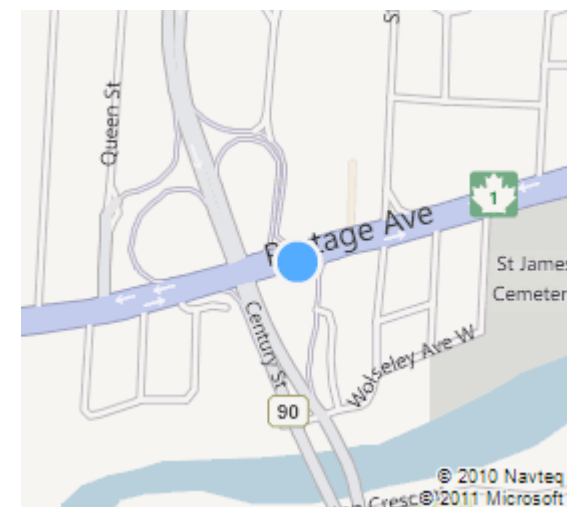
